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What is Being Served

When invited to a table to dine at someone's house, you may not always know what will be served for dinner. It can be a mystery as to what is being set before you, especially if your host is from another culture.

God is from another culture, as He is perfect and provided the perfect meal for us. It has only come to my attention that not all people know what they're eating. So, I have come to share the ingredients of the meal's preparation for a greater understanding that one can thoroughly enjoy being with Him. Then by appreciating all the efforts that have gone into His preparation, we can fully delight in dining with Him.

Understand that some of what I'll be sharing will be new as I am only the pen of the ready writer. So, I will take notes by messenger angels about what the Lord Jesus Christ, come in the flesh, will reveal to me.

At the last supper with His apostles, four groups of believers were in the room. I bring this up because this is a part of the preparation for what is being served in the meal of His body, blood, soul, and divinity to meet all humanity.

First off, everyone in the room is in different stages of growth. I say this because our living souls never die, whether, in eternal life or eternal damnation, we live on. "To be absent from the body is to be present with the Lord." The lecture reads from the altar of humanity, the written word of God out loud. The Holy Spirit then takes the word, becomes flesh and dwelling among us, and builds us line upon line, precept upon precept, here a little, there a little, as a church into a spotlessly adorned bride. This became his invisible spiritual armor. God, as an ever-present help in time of need, delivered him from lions, wolves, and bears while defending His sheep as his Lord had become one with him when going into battle fearlessly against them.

Being without distraction and full focus on God also prepared David to face giants in his life before fearful armies, diminishing their power from a lack of reliance on the Lord of Hosts. The army that did not believe in his God became like sands, driven by the wind, next to his immovable stance of faith that trusted the Lord like an immovable rock.

I say to you in encouragement that David's faith and trust in the Lord of Hosts was illustrated in every psalm, written in the Book of Psalms, which entered his heart in song as "God inhabits the praises of His people" with a full armor. David was our example that this was

accomplished with the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. "For lest the Lord build the house they that labor, labor in vain." Some pick and choose how they will build their own relationship with The Lord, but in the face of adversity under many afflictions, "The righteous are as bold as lions."

Word of caution: remember, "Lest the Lord build the house they that labor, labor in vain." Do not blame others for your mistakes by pointing fingers in the name of the Lord through the seduction of pride. For you can end up blaming God, like the way Adam spoke about Eve, which negated his own hand in the affair, "It was the woman that you gave me," he told God as his sin of missing the Lord's presence for eating the forbidden fruit, too, was too painful for him to bear. For Adam manipulated, causing him to deny the truth of the situation as he stood by and watched Eve eat the forbidden fruit first when he was supposed to be there to protect her from it. He instead used her to see what would happen to her for an answer for himself.

Don't use others by manipulating truth to find answers because this gets ahead of God's timing and invites pride to enter in.

Remember that He is the Father and we are to go to Him for wisdom without taking matters into our own hands. I've learned to be invited from a humble place. To do otherwise, you're inviting God to sit at your altar rather than meeting Him in that humble place of His.
