Why do we usually have to be moved out of our comfort zones to be sparked to seek God's help and love in order to pray? The Angst of Prayer

"When we know not what to pray the Holy Spirit makes intercession for us," and His sweet spirit tastes good as it guides us to find our words and the way into the bosom of God's love.

Ephesians Chapter 2:1-8. "You formerly were dead as a result of your transgressions and sins, which were your way of life in this worldly era, obeying the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit that is now at work among the children of rebellion. We were all numbered among them at one time, too.

We were ruled by our sinful nature, succumbing to the temptations of the flesh and desires. And like all others, we were by nature children of wrath, but God is rich in his mercy, and because he had such great love for us, he brought us to life with Christ when we were already dead through sin—it is by grace that you have been saved. He raised us in union with Christ Jesus and enthroned us with him in the heavens so that in the ages to come, he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace evidenced by his mercy to us in Christ Jesus, for it is by grace that you have been saved through faith.

This has not come from you but from the gift of God. It does not come from works so that no one can boast, for we are God's handiwork and created in Christ Jesus for a life of good works that God had prepared us to do. As we were dead in our trespasses of sin, but God in His mercy delivers us from them all," by the power from the riches of His merciful kingdom while learning to indulge in the prayers of His grace.

We are used to the abuse of sin because we are numb to it while walking around like dead men in our senses, for how else would we continue to settle for abuse in place of love unless we were numbskulls.

My emotions and thoughts were separated until I realized that I needed to ask God to make me fully alive by the power of His Son, Jesus Christ, who said, "I am the resurrection and the life, he who believes in me though he were dead yet shall he live." He is our example of what it is to be fully alive in the circling cycle of love by His regenerative resurrecting blood. So, where does this leave us?

"We have not because we ask not, because when we ask, we ask amiss, still seeking the pleasures of this world." Yes, we have needs, but it's so easy to ask for what we want in excess of them because it is Satan's ploy to distract us from being full-time servants of the Lord.

So, "If you have the faith of a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, get up and be cast into the sea, and it shall be done."

There's a growth progression in prayer because as we grow in faith, everything around us moves and changes over time. We grow at different paces spiritually. Just like land formations that are moved during land erosion and earthquakes progression over many years or abruptly, we grow.

Jesus states, "Unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground, it cannot reproduce after its own kind." Who is Jesus? our heart's throne. This removes our angst with Him in prayer as we've been opened to His direct line of heart, touching all hearts with God every time we pray.

Don't Lose Your Pearls

I see every prayer as a costly pearl because the regenerative living blood of Jesus Christ paid for it. The Messiah of us Jews and to anyone else who wants to overcome the insanity of the world by receiving the gift of escaping into the resurrection-circling cycle of love. For "God delights in a just weight," which balances out a mind to be sound and have peace. We all now have a choice to trust Him for it spiritually, for eternal life, or to keep getting headaches by moving into the mind of flesh. For by trying to figure things out from seductive spirits of pride, we're prevented from trusting God as His children when this happens.

So, keep your pearls strung together by having an attitude with a single focus of thought on the light of God's Kingdom of truth. Don't get distracted by the spirits that live in the dark, or the line of your prayer string will break, and your focus of vision will be lost by winds that will divide your thoughts. "For a double-minded man is unstable in all of his ways and let him not believe that he will receive anything from the Lord," is stated in scripture.

This is why perseverance is required in prayer to prevent the mindset of the flesh and the tainting of the world from entering in as they must be shaken off. For just as Jesus Christ was birthed in Mary His mother, He is now birthed within us. He grows through prayer and Bible reading while meditating on Him, and He enters into us every time we redirect or focus on Him and away from all else. This should especially happen when partaking of the Holy Eucharist.

The Apostle Paul said, "Pray without ceasing," for this reason as well. I hope that my mind will eventually not waiver back to this world that I may be in, and fully spiritually no longer of it. Yes, pray it through, and when we grow to one day where our yearning out
